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### [Cyberbullying Featured in Online Educator Curriculum](#) - for the classroom and students

The ALL IN toolkit for educators, K-12, was released in September 2017. It is available at no cost for educators. ALL IN contains 32 lessons, one for each week of the school year. Each month has a specific theme. The month of December focuses on Cyberbullying. Information includes:

- **Education:** A robust educational power point for the classroom, titled, *"Cyberbullying: What students can do to respond, address and prevent."*
- **Classroom Activity:** Students participate in researching the safety policies and rules of various social media platform or other sites with online interaction, documenting them in the *"social media privacy and reporting assessment"* document, then sharing the information as a group.

### **Kindness Conversations - for the Classroom**

Interactive classroom (or club) discussion questions featuring real life cyberbullying scenarios. The activity is structured so that students read each of the scenarios, decide how they would respond, and to then have discussion. The intent is not to have a right or wrong answer, but to have meaningful reflection, dialogue, and education about how to handle situations which are commonly faced by many students. Two versions were developed; one for elementary school-age children, and a second for middle and high school students. Funded in part by others.
